## A hot challenge for CEOs

he El Niño heat could not deter the head honchos of corporations from putting on their trainers and running for a good cause.

The Edge Kuala Lumpur Rat Race 2016 saw 49 CEOs run the 1.5km circuit in the middle of Kuala Lumpur in a scorching 35°C.

Before the race, Matrix Concepts Holdings Bhd director Datuk Lim Kiu Hock was genuinely worried about running in the blistering heat. A Rat Race first-timer, he had no idea what to expect but he was glad to participate in the race.

"I am not hoping to finish first," he remarked. "I just want to participate and support the cause."

As corporations capitalise on society at large to build their financial empires, they should return the favour, he said, adding that companies that expend energy on charitable activities possess a sense of selflessness.

"It shows that companies have humanitarian values. It is not just about making money. It is also about giving profits back to society. Corporate Malaysia asks society for money, so it has to give back," Lim commented.

The CEO's race saw both young and old corporate heads vying for the top title.

After the race was flagged off by Eco World Development Group Bhd president and CEO Datuk Chang Kim Wah at 3.30pm, Microlink Solutions Bhd CEO Chia Yong Wei reached the finish line at the Malaysia Tourism Centre (MaTiC) in six minutes.

fun," Chia, 39, said, adding that he was proud to have finished first. "It was very competitive, so I had to try my hardest."

Maybank director Udaishankar Raman, who was also with Chia in the 100Plus booth, said he had fun but it was challenging to run in the heat.

Chia said although Udaishankar was far behind, he had his eyes on him. "Harimau, I'm coming," he told Udaishankar, who laughed.

Matching the enthusiasm of the runners in the CEO's category were their staff, cheering on their leaders from the entrance of MaTiC.

Proving that they were more than just cogs in a machine, the staff of the various corporations braved the heat and waited until their CEOs had completed the race. Not only that, they stayed on to cheer their colleagues who ran the 4km team race.

DKSH Malaysia Sdn Bhd head of country management Nicholas McLaren clinched the second spot in the CEO's male category, clocking 6 minutes and 35 seconds.

He said he intends to win the fastest male CEO title next year. "I like to make grand promises and deliver on them," he added.

McLaren, who has lived in Singapore and Malaysia over the past seven years, said although he was used to the equatorial heat in both countries, running the Rat Race was challenging.

"I don't really run in the afternoon at 3.30pm," he remarked.

Maxis Bhd head of network Abdul Karim Ali, who came in third, said he

"It was very hot but it was great was exhausted but felt good about it. "At least, I have covered my exercise quota for the week," he laughed.

> He said although he frequently runs mid to long distances, the short CEO's race was rather challenging. "Usually, in a long-distance run, the first 5km is just warming up. But in this race, I had to sprint right from the beginning. It was not easy."

The 16th Rat Race proved to be a sweet moment for Ireka Corp Bhd group deputy managing director Monica Lai in the female CEO's category. She aced it, clocking 8 minutes and 21 seconds. Last year, she was the first runner-up.

"I came into the race trying to beat my own time," she said. "And I did it. I finished the race 25 seconds faster and in this heat too. I am really happy."

Lai said Ireka had participated in the Rat Race for the past seven years and looks forward to it every year.

First runner-up and Rat Race first-timer, Nur Suhaila Saad of Boustead Heavy Industries Corp Bhd, said she had a blast. "I think it is a very good charity run. I had heard a lot about the race before but I had the chance to participate in it only this year."

Nur said she did not feel any pressure running in the CEO's category and that it was heartening to see the other female CEOs sweating it out for charity.

"Most of them were relaxed and they were quite sporting. Some of them were even wearing make-up, so it was really fun. I got to see a different side of them," she smiled.

# Braving the heat for a good

t was 12.30 in the afternoon last Tuesday when participants of The Edge Kuala Lumpur Rat Race 2016 began streaming into the starting and finishing point at Malaysia Tourism Centre in Jalan Ampang.

Among the early birds was Feruni Ceramiche Sdn Bhd's team, who came dressed in the company's Feruni Tiling Academy tilers' aprons, yellow Wellington boots and safety helmets.

"We are least affected by the hot weather. We are very excited about this event. The race is a very good way for us to give back to the community," Feruni director and general manager of operation Gidget Lim told *The Edge* before the start of the run, which is being held for the 16th time this year.

"We trained together to build up our stamina. The race also created an occasion for us to bond with our colleagues."

The temperature soared to 35° C, but it did not affect the spirit of the participants.

In fact, most of them took part in a warm-up session conducted by a trainer from Celebrity Fitness.

By 3pm, most participants were milling around the starting point of the charity run.

This year's Rat Race collected RM1.314 million,70% of which will be channelled to 15 charitable and

non-governmental organisations to support their training and educational programmes.

The balance of the proceeds will go to The Edge Education Foundation for its English and financial literacy programmes, which are aimed at equipping underprivileged stu-

dents in selected secondary schools with skills they need when they leave school.

At 3.30pm, the CEO race was flagged off by Eco World Development Group Bhd president and CEO Datuk Chang Kim Wah.

Fifteen minutes later, Affin managing director Teng Chee Wai flagged off the runners for the senior, open and mixed categories.

According to The Edge Media Group publisher and CEO Ho Kay Tat, the Rat Race has raised over RM20 million since its inception 16 years ago.

The race has been regarded as an annual must-attend social responsibility event for Corporate Malaysia.

"This was my third run ... a fun

thing to do and at the same time, we are helping the needy," Matrix Concepts' head of corporate legal department Ong Eng Hock said after the race.

For Vistage Malaysia Sdn Bhd chairman Richard Wong, it was his maiden race. He said he was happy that the company was given an opportunity to contribute. "It feels good to do something for the community," he added.

Complaints about the searing heat of the sun were heard among the runners.

"Half way through [the race], I

"I will do this again next year, and I will make sure I will be fitter by then."

Prizes were presented to winners of 16 categories, including the CEO, senior, mixed and open team as well as team spirit and best-dressed team.

Supporters made the event all the more exciting. S P Setia Bhd's supporters came with "war drums" to cheer their team while others waved decorative banners. A team even performed a lion dance.

After the race, the attendees adjourned for dinner at Saloma Bistro & Theatre Restaurant. They were also entertained to a performance sponsored by Astro Malaysia Holdings Bhd.

Ho thanked the attendees and partners for making the race a success.
